

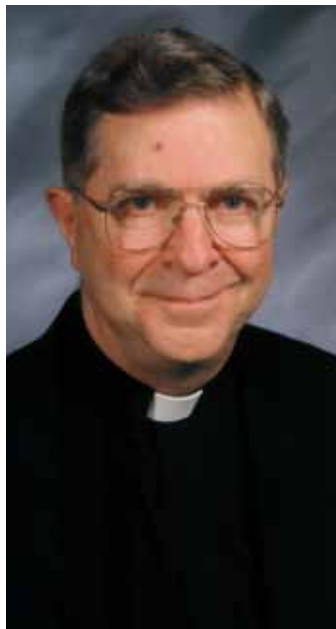
Jesuits Call for Immigration Reform

All Jesuit provincials in the United States signed a letter that was delivered to the White House and each individual congressional office on June 4, calling for immediate and comprehensive immigration reform. “With the new Arizona law, there is a real risk that life on our national borders will become subject to a patchwork of state responses; Congress is faced with both a constitutional and moral imperative to act,” said **Fr. Thomas Smolich, SJ**, president of the Jesuit Conference of the United States. “Despite what some reactionary politicians would have us believe, we can secure our borders in a way that does not cost us our humanity.”
