Fr. J. Thomas McClain, SJ, has been appointed general treasurer of the Society of Jesus by Fr. General Adolfo Nicolás, SJ. Fr. 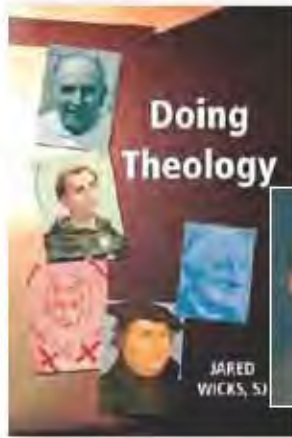

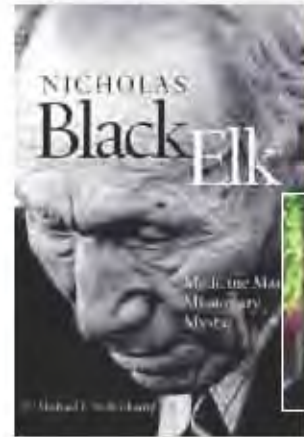
Whatever You Do: Helping Students Think Deeply About Service Experiences (National Catholic Educational Association, July 15, 2009)
 Edited by Fr. Martin T. Connell, SJ, and Christiane Connors

Fr. Martin T. Connell, SJ, and Christiane Connors address foundational and practical challenges of Christian service programs through essays by practitioners who have demonstrated skill in the field. This book considers specific principles that may be taught to students, strategies to point out these principles, and steps to turn service into a transformative learning experience. Fr. Connell serves as the headmaster of St. Peter Claver High School and Our Lady Queen of Peace Educational Center in Dodoma, Tanzania, and as province assistant for education in the Eastern Africa Province of the Jesuits.



Doing Theology (Paulist Press, November 1, 2009)

Fr. Jared W. Wicks, SJ, shows how major Christian thinkers (Irenaeus, Origen, Luther, and others) pursued theological understanding in his new book *Doing Theology*. Nicholas Black Elk: Medicine Man, Missionary, Mystic (University of Oklahoma Press, November 30, 2009)

Fr. Michael F. Steltenkamp, SJ, contributes this biographical work on the famous Lakota holy man known as Nicholas Black Elk. The book deals with the last 50 years of Black Elk's life, devoted to the "synthesis of Native and Christian religious practice" that made him revered among his people. Fr. Steltenkamp serves as professor of anthropology and religious studies at Wheeling Jesuit University.
